Cast includes Jeffrey Byron, Gary Imhof, Dennis Quaid, Lou Richards, Priscilla Barnes, Alan Reed, Edward Andrews, Robert Emhardt, and Alan Hewitt. 87 minutes, 1978.

Rock My World - This is a pretty good comedy set in England (however shot and funded in Canada) that went directly to video in the U.S. although is far more involving than its theatrical fate could show. We see an aristocratic British couple lease their mansion to a rock band and end up posing as the butler and chef while the misfit team ultimately shows up. Observing the interplay create between these extremely variant generations and lifestyles is fun and the music is shockingly catchy. Cast includes Peter O'Toole, Joan Plowright, Alicia Silverstone, Jaimz Woolvett, Keram Malicki-Sanchez, Christopher Bolton, and Lochlyn Munro. 106 minutes, 2002.

Cry "Havoc" - Girl volunteers join some frustrated American nurses on struggling island of Baton throughout WW2. Exposes its level causes and integrates expected stereotypes, however additionally presents pretty frank image of battle. Robert Mitchum has a small part as a dying cadet. Cast includes Margaret Sullivan, Joan Blondell, Ann Sothorn, Fay Bainter, Marsha Hunt, and Ella Raines. 97 minutes, 1943.

Zoolander - Male model Derek Zoolander is hired to help stop a group of assassins who are posing as male models. He must somehow penetrate this private group. Making things even more challenging is Hansel, a new, up and coming model, who keeps screwing things up for Zoolander.

The House of Yes - On a stormy day in 1983, a youthful man brings his fiancée home to meet his bankrupt Washington, D.C. family, containing his crazy twin sis, Jackie-O, whose fantasies in Jacqueline Kennedy have extended to the point of reenacting the JFK assassination-with live bullets. Well made black comedy, based on the stage production by Wendy MacLeod. Cast includes Parker Posey, Josh Harnilton, Tori Spelling, Freddie Prinze, Jr., Genevieve Bujold, and Rachael Leigh Cook. 90 minutes, 1997.

Casino - Sam Rothstein has worked his way through the mob ranks and now runs the casino that his Chicago outfit owns. When mafia strong arm Nicky Santoro arrives in town, Sam pleads with him to keep a low profile. Business is good, and his services aren't really necessary. Nicky just can't help himself, and he starts banging heads. Now Sam's peace world gets turned completely upside down.

The Gaucho - Cheesy melodramatics and moralizing, and not enough action hinder this lesser Fairbanks piece, in which

he plays a notorious, egotistic South American man. Cast includes Douglas Fairbanks, Lupe Velez, Eve Southern, Gustav von Seyffertitz, Nigel de Brulier, and Geraine Greear. 96 minutes, 1927.
